## Rehabbed school bus to rehab firefighters

Waterboro is about to be the second fire department in Maine to have a rehab bus to support firefighters on scene. Drivers going by the Waterboro Fire Department's Central Station can see a fire engine red former school bus sitting in the parking lot. It is close to being put into service as a firefighter rehabbing station, to cool workers on hot days, and warm them on cold. It is to be called Rehab 1.

For some months, much effort has been expended by volunteers and local businesses to re-purpose the school bus to offer a station for helping firefighters manage the stress of fighting the variety of fires and calls.

According to Lt. Mike Fraser,

"Last winter was a brutal one for anyone working in outdoor conditions, and there were some particularly brutal fires. One had firefighters out in the elements for over nine hours with temperatures around minus 28 degrees."

Over a year ago, Chief Matt Bors approached Colin Walsh, Business Manager for RSU 57, to see if the district had a spare bus. For the past few years, the department has had the Waterboro Alfred Rehab Trailer (WART) for support. The WART carried tents, tarps and other supplies to support the needs of those fighting fires. After some very freezing firefighting experiences, Bors heard back from Walsh that the District Board of Directors had voted to donate an out-of-service, but still usable bus to WFD. The board

## Thanksgiving boxes

The busiest place in Alfred last week was the York County Food Pantry. Lines formed outside the old barn on Shaker Hall, where volunteers handed out boxes of the items needed for Thanksgiving dinners to all who came. There were 1,528 boxes issued, which fed 5,785 people.

There were many who volunteered, including students from the University of New England to set up on Sunday and those from Massabesic High School who also help set up; plus students from Berwick Academy; The New School in Kennebunk; and Tom's of Maine; Curtis Lake Church; York County Federal Credit Union; Ocean Community Credit Union; Sanford Rotary Club; York County Shelter Residents and regular York County food pantry volunteers. There were upwards of 180 volunteers working on the distribution of boxes.

## Santa and Masonic Hall

It's that time again and anyone looking for Santa doesn't have to go to a crowded mall, but to Masonic Hall in Alfred. He will be there Saturday, Dec. 12 from 10

a.m. to noon. Visitors can have cookies and cocoa with him.

The Fraternal Lodge is observing its 50th year in the lodge building at 165 Waterboro Road. Previous to occupying the present building, the Masons met on the third floor of the building in which DeWolfe and Wood have their antiquarian book store. The Masonic Lodge first met in Shapleigh, then in the Alfred Academy (that building still exists on Court Street).

There are still traces of the Masonic presence on the third floor of DeWolfe and Woods' building with pictures visible on the walls and ceiling, thanks to the Silliker boys who had a rock band and practiced up there. They removed part of the false ceiling for more amplification and discovered the mural, which had been installed by the Masons.

The original occupants of the building were the Littlefield brothers, who built it. The impetus for building was the railroad which was coming through Alfred. The opening of the building was a grand affair, with a band from Biddeford providing music and many people in attendance. George Came, Alfred's faithful diarist, described it in his journal. The next owners were Levitt and Company, who ran a general store. John Roberts appears to have followed the Levitts, having an IGA grocery store with lun-

cheon run by Maddie Roberts that was quite popular with people working at the courthouse. Then a series of antique dealers did business there, including the Canneys and Fred Price. When the Masons moved in upstairs they had a 100 year lease which probably is why they put up with mounting those stairs for so long.

## Walking nativity

The date is Saturday, Dec. 19 for the "Walking Nativity" in Alfred. Parishioners of the Parish Church, some dressed as nativity participants, will walk around Alfred accompanied by a donkey, sheep, dog, chicken and perhaps more barnyard animals. Caroling is on the agenda. They will return to Conant Chapel for hot chocolate. Planning the affair are Su LaChance, Robin Tucker-Gahm and Rev. Diane Harvey.

Other activities include the Women's Guild meeting on Tuesday, Dec. 8 at 1 p.m. in Conant Chapel. There will be a Yankee Swap at the meeting.

The Parish Paddlers will be hosted by the Dugovics on Dec. 20 with a potluck luncheon and an ornament swap.

added the condition that the bus be available to departments in all the district's towns. Fraser, one of the overseers of the project, along with Lt. Mike Holbrook and Lt. John Cloonan, said, "We were already doing mutual aid with those departments and more surrounding communities, so that was not a problem."

Volunteers began stepping in and the work began. The story of this second Rehab Bus in Maine differs quite a bit from the story of the first on in Gorham, however. According to Gorham Chief Lefebvre, "Ours is over ten years old and is owned and shared with Windham, Westbrook and Standish. It was obtained with a Homeland security grant and donated by Gorham School Department." A school department also donated Waterboro's bus, but volunteers

did most of the entire repurposing in-house. Some funds came from the department budget, but installation of the vast majority of the equipment and most of the labor was done by a dedicated group of volunteers. EMT and Selectman Jon Gale and Cloonan agree that more than \$20,000 was saved by the work done by those volunteers.

While the bus was no longer rated for transporting school children, it was still usable. According to Cloonan, the project manager, much of the surface of the bus was covered with stickers, lettering and other safety information notices. "We had to strip it first, work on some rust, and then we painted the entire thing, by hand. It was quite a big in-house job!" While some materials were donated, volunteers did all of the work. Then the bus was taken to Hartford Equipment in Sanford for mechanical repairs and to Sanford Radiator for radiator and fuel tank work.

Cloonan described the process of transforming the interior. "We took out all the seats but one, right up front by the door. Then we bolted four of them along the side wall of the bus, like a long bench for firefighters to sit on to rest." They installed a shelf for helmets and hooks for hanging coats. Normand Electric of Alfred donated wiring and electrical supplies while NAPA of Waterboro donated a substantial generator to power the three bus heaters and other needed appliances and lighting. They purchased some small appliances, including hair dryers, to be used to thaw frozen air packs in winter and a coffee maker. Fraser said, "When you combine cold and water you get ice, and the air packs we need for smoke-filled environments freeze up and are useless. We'll be able to pass a frozen pack in through a window, get a fresh one and continue to fight the fire." A surface is set up

for the coffee maker and totes full of snacks when firefighters take a break. Fraser added, "When they come in, EMTs will check their vital signs and make sure they're OK, and we'll have water and coffee and snacks to keep them going."

During the summer, the needs are different. Lee's RV in Windham discounted two roof-mounted RV air conditioning units to be used to keep the interior of the bus cool. An RV awning was installed on the side of the bus to provide the shelter of shade as well.

A major alteration of the bus interior was done at the rear. With the help of A1 Environmental Services, a porta-potty was installed to provide secure and private sanitary facilities. Mike Bennett, Deputy

Chief Lisa Bennett's husband, fabricated a folding set of aluminum steps with a drop-down railing to provide access to that section.

All emergency lighting on the bus was donated by S. A. McLean of Limerick, and installed by volunteers, and RSD Graphics provided the lettering on the bus. It reads "Rehab 1" on the front and rear, and "Waterboro Fire-EMS" on the sides. Once a siren is in place, and seat belts are on the one remaining school bus seat, Rehab 1 will be ready for duty.

At that time, Rehab 1 will become one more piece of equipment that Sanford or Biddeford dispatch will call on when needed by surrounding towns. Visitors to the Dec. 12 Open House will see Rehab 1 in all its glory.
